<sup>2</sup>TRM Support and Elective Courses – Student must complete two of the following courses: TRM 332, TRM 361, TRM 362, TRM 363E, TRM 421, TRM 440. The remaining hours may be filled with additional support courses, approved elective courses, and/or courses completed as part of a Minor or Specialization. Additionally, students also have the option to take TRM 319, TRM 320 or TRM 350; and/or apply for an evaluation of TRM 358 or TRM 359 in order to meet their 42 hr Institutional Requirements. Students may also opt to take any approved 300/400 level course to satisfy the 42 hr Institutional Requirement. This Program is Open-ended. Students may enter the Program at any semester.
